770 years of viticulture history. Château Pape Clément is one of the oldest Grands Crus in Bordeaux. The very first vines were planted by Bertrand de Goth in the 13th century. Archbishop of Bordeaux, he was elected pope in 1305, taking the name Clement V. The Château is named after its illustrious founder. The estate can take pride in having produced wine on the same land since 1252.

- Drastic sorting of the berries
- Fermentation with selected native yeast
